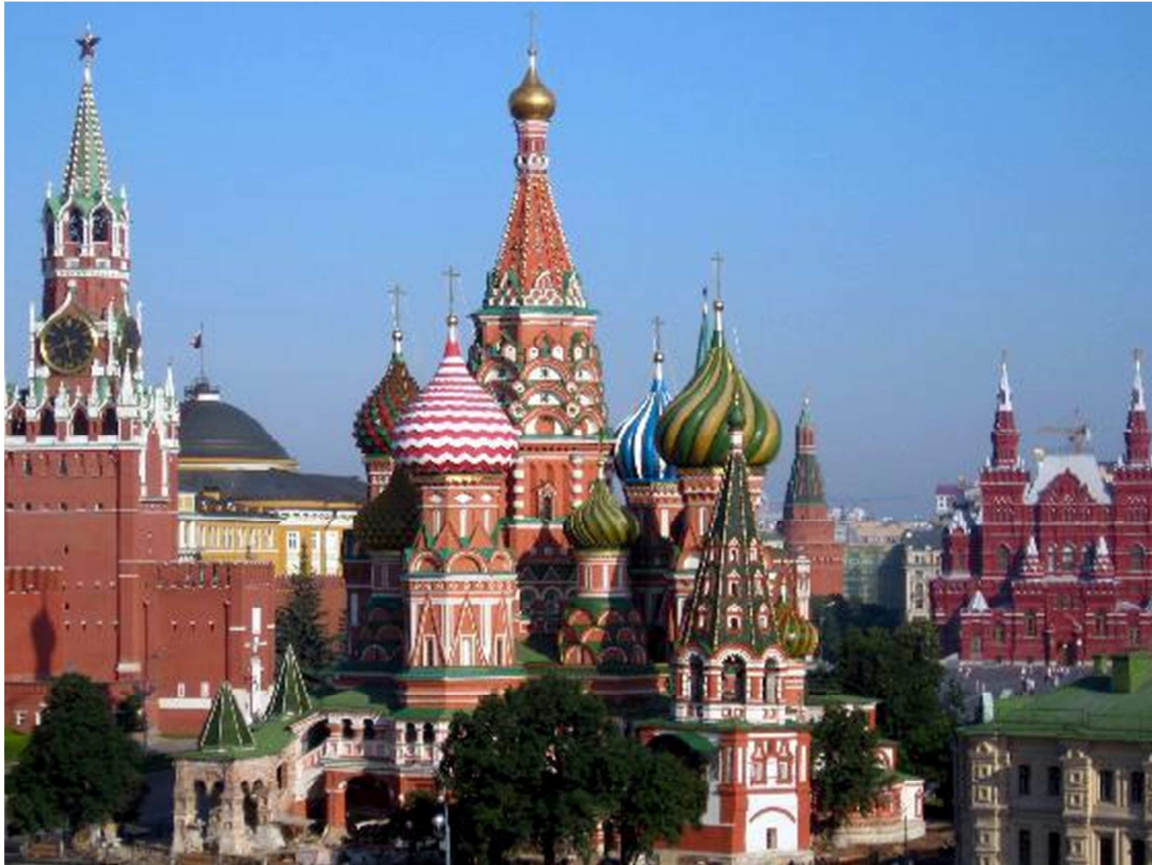
VI. I understand that any additional money to the trip's full amount that comes in will be used to support the rest of the team and missions operations during the mission trip.

### **Thurs. April 21<sup>st</sup>**

Depart for Moscow!

**Friday April 22<sup>nd</sup>**-Arrive in Moscow ▪ Meet your JE guide at the airport and transfer into the city ▪ Check into your hotel ▪ Spend time with your JE guide for a time of cultural orientation & prayer ▪ Short walking tour of city center ▪ Dinner ▪ Devotions and discussion.

**Saturday April 23<sup>rd</sup>**-Breakfast ▪ Depart by train to Kaluga ▪ You will first check your hotel ▪ Lunch ▪ Meet with Pastor Grigory Tropets along with 3-4 interpreters at the local church ▪ Prepare for a Youth Outreach at the church ▪ Dinner ▪ Devotions and discussion.

**Sunday April 24<sup>th</sup>**-Breakfast ▪ Help with ministry in the church service ▪ Attend the local service ▪ Lunch ▪ work with local ministry throughout the afternoon ▪ Dinner with American missionary, David Ford who has been working in Kaluga for a number of years after arriving with Josh McDowell Ministry ▪ Devotions and discussion.

### **Monday April 25<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast ▪ Ministry at the blind and visually impaired orphanage in Meshovsks (small village about 1 hour drive from Kaluga by bus) ▪ Here you will spend time doing several craft projects and story telling with these kids and it was a great jump into the ministry ▪ Return to Kaluga ▪ Dinner ▪ Devotions and discussion.

### **Tuesday April 26<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast ▪ Ministry at another large orphanage; this orphanage has many children who have some severe disabilities and have been neglected by families. Here you will have various opportunities to create programs and activities for these children. You will work with the ministry to create programs for the day and how to prepare ▪ Dinner ▪ Devotions and discussion.

### **Wednesday April 27<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast ▪ Meet with local church and their youth- create a sports event ▪ Luncheon with Pastor & Youth at the church ▪ Prepare to depart by train to Moscow ▪ Check into hotel ▪ Possibility to meet with another missionary in Moscow ▪ Dinner ▪ Devotions and discussion.

### **Thursday April 28<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast ▪ Tour Red Square, shopping and leisure time on Arbat Street ▪ Lunch ▪ Take a guided tour of the city by coach to learn about this history of both former USSR and the current country of Russia along with the city of Moscow ▪ Dinner at Hard Rock Cafe ▪ Final night of devotions and discussion.
