GRADING AND RANKING

- Due to the academic strength of students and the rigorous college preparatory curriculum, NRCA does not rank its students. Valedictorian and Salutatorian are the only ranks designated.
- GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale.
- GPA is updated each semester, but once yearly grades are available, only those grades are used in the GPA calculation.
- GPA includes all subjects with the exception of teacher assistants, study hall, and fitness classes in grades 9-12.
- AP courses receive 2 additional quality points.
- Honors courses receive 1 additional quality point.

NRCAPIus VIRTUAL ACADEMY

NRCA offers a significant list of online courses through NRCAPlus Virtual Academy. These courses require an additional fee and meet with an on-campus proctor during the school day.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Students may earn college credit through a partnership with the College at Southeastern in Wake Forest, NC. The College at Southeastern awards college credit for 7 courses taught at NRCA.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

NRCA offers many extra-curricular opportunities in the areas of Fine Arts and Athletics. Student Council elections are held each year. Students in grades 7-9 and grades 10-12 are selected by a faculty council for the National Junior Honor Society and the National Honor Society respectively. NRCA offers many clubs, including a Leadership Club, Chemistry Club, Youth and Government, and a Culture Club. Each club provides extra-curricular options and opportunities for leadership roles within the student body.



Additional Honors and AP courses are offered through the NRCAPlus Virtual Academy for an additional fee and are subject to the same eligibility requirements as other advanced courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 12 hours of community service per year of attendance at NRCA is required. Typically, at least 75% of NRCA graduates volunteer over 100 hours of community service during high school. In addition, every student must participate in at least one mission trip during high school.
