




### **ELECTIVES**

- One elective class meets daily
- Grades 7-8 choose a first-choice elective and four alternate electives. Grade 6 chooses one first-choice elective and 2 alternate electives.
- PowerSchool attempts to place students in first-choice elective, but seats are limited in each class, so choose alternate electives carefully.
- Alternate list is not in priority order. PowerSchool selects randomly.
- No preference for registering earlier.
- Do NOT select the same elective as both first choice and alternate. This limits your options and does not boost chances.
- Read elective information carefully in the Insider's Guide before making selections. Choose only electives in which there is interest but be open to trying new things.
- There is a one-week drop/add period for middle school electives and two weeks for high school courses. This is during the first week of school. Students are encouraged to try the class for a day or two before dropping. They often find that they enjoy what they didn't think they would enjoy.











- Required courses have green check (already selected for you)

- 2. Choose ONE elective. Note that there is more than one page of options for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>
- 3. Click 'okay'
- 4. Do the same for Alternate Electives except choose TWO (grade 6) or FOUR (grades 7-8)



### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Required courses: Algebra I, World History, US History, Biology, Chemistry (CP and Honors Tracks)

ACT taken junior year with a score of 16+ in math, reading, or composite

25 Community Service hours per year of attendance at NRCA.

### CHOOSING CORE CLASSES

- Review NRCA graduation tracks and requirements as well as course prerequisites in the HS Course Insider's Guide.
- Choose the most challenging courses in which you can make an A or B, especially if you plan to apply to selective colleges.
- Consider your interests and evaluate the demands on your time when determining course load. Plan to spend time on activities and service to be well-rounded. Taking even one AP class can diminish the time available to study for other courses and involve in activities.
- Course selection and grades are the two primary factors in college admission.
- While honors and AP courses are beneficial when applying to selective colleges, understand that Honors and AP classes are not a requirement to get into college.
- Challenge, but do not overwhelm, yourself.

### **ELECTIVES**

- One elective class meets daily

### FOREIGN LANGUAGE


- Note graduation track requirements

- NRCAPlus: Latin, Chinese, American Sign Language, French, German
- SENIORS who have completed foreign language can register for AP Psychology, AP Spanish, Early Dismissal, an NRCAPlus class, or a TA period in the Media Center (limited availability)

## GENERAL PREREQUISITE FOR HONORS AND AP COURSES

Honors classes: A in previous CP class

AP classes: A or B in previous AP class or A in previous Honors class

Registration based on first semester average this year. Final course decision will be based on year-end average.



### **DUAL ENROLLMENT**



NRCA has a dual enrollment agreement with the fully accredited College at Southeastern. This is the **only** college from which NRCA accepts dual enrollment credit.



Several classes offered at NRCA and instructed by NRCA teachers are eligible for college credit through dual enrollment.



Once enrolled in an eligible course, student will be given an option to register with the college to receive dual enrollment credit.



DE registration is directly with SEBTS and runs from Nov 1 – early Feb













- Click pencil

### DROP/ADD



After final grades have been posted in June, parents may email Mrs. Etheridge to request the student to move up or down a level (CP to Honors, Honors to AP, etc.) in a core subject if the final grade qualifies.



Students may request class changes during the two-week drop/ add period after start of school by filling out the Drop/Add form, having it signed by a parent, and submitting it in the tray on the front lobby desk.



Students are encouraged to remain in elective classes for several days before requesting to drop. Often, they find that they enjoy the class even if it was not their first choice.




The two week drop/add period is strictly enforced.
